Dear Milwood Elementary Parents and Families,

I am sending you this letter to welcome you to our 2023-24 school year! I think it's safe to say that we are all looking forward to being back together. What I hope to do with this letter is share some specific information about what we do at Milwood Elementary so that you feel well-prepared to be a part of our Panther-Family.

Our School Structure

At Milwood Elementary, we are scheduled to have the following classes for 2023-24*:

* Please Note that should our enrollment increase, there is a possibility that our split-grade classrooms will be dissolved and become one grade level.

- ★ Our K-3rd Grade classes are self-contained.
- ★ Our 4th/5th Graders move to different Teachers for their core instruction.
- ★ In addition, we have shared support with our School Psychologist, Clinical Social Worker, Speech Therapists, Teacher Consultant, and Instructional Coaches for Reading and Math.
- ★ At Milwood Elementary, we pride ourselves on taking a Student-centered approach which looks to use all of our resources to the best of our ability.

Arrival and Dismissal at Milwood Elementary

School begins at 8:50 am / Students may be dropped off AFTER 8:25 am

School ends at 3:50 pm We strongly encourage Parents / Families to have

Students remain in school for the full school day.



Bus Riders

Students who are Bus Riders will arrive at the front, main entrance. Students who are Bus Riders will exit / depart through the front, main entrance.



Walkers

Students who are Walkers go with their Teacher(s) to our Rear Pickup Area (Parking Lot) and are dismissed from there.

Arrival and Dismissal at Milwood Elementary (CONTINUED)

School begins at **8:50** am / Students may be dropped off **AFTER 8:25** am School ends at **3:50** pm

Drop Offs and Pickups

- Students who are driven to school and picked up at dismissal will be dropped off (after 8:25 am) and picked up in our rear parking lot.
- ❖ AM Drop Offs are available from 8:25 am 8:50 am. After 8:50 am, Students should be brought to our front, main entrance and enter through the office. Please note that for Drop-offs, Staff are available to supervise AFTER 8:25 am. Drop-off Students are able to use the Playground until Lineup at 8:44 am.



- The lot can be accessed off of Lovers Lane.
- Once you enter the lot, cars can form two (2) lanes of one way traffic, following the route around the yellow pylons.
- We ask that drivers remain in your vehicle during pickups. An adult will escort your child to your vehicle.
- Once you have your child, we ask that you wait to allow us to move you out of the lot safely.
- Students are available for pickup in the rear lot until 3:55 pm. If you arrive after that time, your Student(s) will need to be picked up at the main, front entrance.











Parent Family Communication

We use a variety of methods to communicate daily, weekly, monthly, and yearly important events at Milwood Elementary. Among them are:

- **Class Dojo** Many of our Teachers utilize Class Dojo as a way to communicate directly with our Parents and Families. We encourage you to sign up with your child's Teacher.
- **School Messenger (via email)** Usually sent by your principal with reminders about important upcoming activities and events. They will come to you in the form of an email. It is vital that you keep our office aware with your most up-to-date contact information including phone and email.
- *Grade-Level Newsletters* Various Grade-Levels send information home specific to their Students and Parents.
- Milwood Facebook Page For those who follow Social Media, we use this page to post important school-related information. (@milwoodelementary on Facebook)
- Milwood Home Page Similar to our Facebook Page, it will also include information on specific Classroom and Grade-Level activities and events. (KPS Website - Milwood Homepage)
- **Google Classroom** Used by many Teachers to post/share assignments and other specific classroom information. Parents find it helpful to stay aware of their Student's activities.





Academic Instructional Focus

We have an experienced and dedicated group of Teachers and Support Staff who utilize a variety of methods and approaches to working with our Students.

Among them are:

- > Whole Group Instruction -
 - Teaching delivered to an entire class
- > Small Group Instruction (One of our Focus-Areas for this school year)
 - o Teaching delivered to a specifically identified smaller group of Students
- > Interventions -
 - Delivered in Small Groups (Most often in Reading) by Title 1 Tutors
- > Reading Recovery -
 - Delivered to identified 1st Graders by our Reading Recovery Teacher
- Students are assessed 3 times each year using:
 - NWEA/MAP Test (3rd-5th) and the Fastbridge Assessment (K-2nd)
 - (Fall/Winter/Spring)
- > 3rd-5th Graders also take the statewide MStep Test each Spring









Specials Classes

Our Milwood Students will have three (3) focused "Specials" Classes each week plus Library Time. The Scheduled time usually works as follows for each class:

- ❖ Art Class = 1x per week / 50 minutes
- ❖ Physical Education Class = 2x per week / 30 minutes each
- ❖ Music Class = 2x per week / 30 minutes each
- ❖ Library = 1 x per week / 30 minutes

Additionally, classes may be scheduled to utilize one of the two (2) Computer Labs we have in our school.

Our Students participate in a 1x Monthly Student Game-Time class prepared and presented by our PlayWorks Coach. These classes are focused on safe, fun, appropriate Recess activities.



3 R's/CHAMPS



We focus on living by our 3 R's: "Respect," "Responsibility," and "Results." These 3 areas are emphasized as we teach our Students what our building-wide expectations are ("CHAMPS"). Our CHAMPS expectations are clear on what "Respect" looks like in the Cafeteria or Playgrounds, and what "Responsibility" looks like in our Classrooms and Hallways. We strive for positive "Results," and look to achieve them by teaching and reminding our Students of our specific expectations consistently throughout the school year.



"Kindness" Theme

Our definition for "Kindness" at Milwood Elementary is very simple:

"Always treat others the way you want to be treated."

This theme is one of our central focus areas, and one which Students hear daily during announcements. We appreciate Parents reinforcing that message and definition with your Panthers.







Social-Emotional Learning (SEL)

We focus on SEL with our Students as a way of both connecting with them, and helping them to cope with all that comes with being a healthy and successful young person. Always looking to work consistently to connect our Students, Staff, and Families, our Milwood SEL Task-Force has developed a calendar which outlines each of our monthly SEL Themes for 2023-24. Each grade-level, Kindergarten through 5th will focus on the same theme each month. The activities used to teach and introduce our themes will vary by grade level, but the goal is for us to be focused on a consistent monthly topic. Our

SEL Monthly Goals are as follows:

- All Year "Kindness"
- September Growth Mindset and Perseverance
- October Bullying Prevention
- November Friendship and Acceptance / Diversity
- December Conflict Resolution
- January Feelings, Emotions, and Coping Skills
- February Self-Esteem
- March Self-Control and Mindfulness
- April Problem-Solving
- May Self Care and Mental Wellness

Restorative Justice

We at Milwood introduced Restorative Practices to our program back during the 2018-19 school year. We expand our knowledge and use each year. Simply put, Restorative Practices look to help Students and Staff seek to repair (or restore) any harm which may result from a conflict. Both Students and Staff will engage in a "Restorative Conversation" when necessary which revolves around three (3) specific questions:



- 1) What happened?
- 2) Who was impacted by what happened?
- 3) What is needed to repair the harm?

The goal of these conversations in grades K-5th is to help Students see and understand how their words or actions can affect others which helps develop "empathy." In the majority of our situations, we are able to reach a positive outcome.

Other Restorative Practices at Milwood Elementary are:

- ★ Classroom 'Community Agreements" Procedures and expectations developed by Students and Teachers together.
- ★ Class "Circle Meetings" A daily or weekly check-in time used as a way of getting to know classmates and discussing important topics.

Our "9.58" theme reflects the world record time for the 100 meter dash set by Usain Bolt in 2009. Each year we share the YouTube video with Staff and Students of him as he breaks down what he is striving to accomplish in each of his races. (YouTube "Usain Bolt - How to Win the 100M") The lesson in his efforts for us is that he (and we) have "lots to accomplish in a very short time" (180 school days). It is a constant reminder for us to make positive and effective use of the time we have together each day.



Parent Teacher Student Organization (P.T.S.O.)

I encourage you to consider becoming a member of our Milwood Elementary P.T.S.O.. This group meets monthly to provide ideas, energy, and support which helps our Students to have beneficial extracurricular resources and experiences. Among their contributions are:

- → Supporting K-5th Grade Fundraising for Field Trips
- → Providing Yard Signs to celebrate our 5th Graders as they move to Middle School
- → Hosting two (2) Scholastic Book Fairs each year (Fall and Spring)
- → Helping to organize our School Dances

Our monthly PTSO Meetings are also a great way for our Parents to receive helpful instructional information and resources about Milwood and KPS. Meetings are for one (1) hour each month. Please consider joining us.

We are aiming to meet on every 2nd Monday of the month with the exception of January (just back from Winter Break).
